Dear Friends:

As more and more Americans report feeling lonely either all of the time or most of the time, there is a need to build greater community resilience as an antidote to combat the “loneliness epidemic.” Our 2023 annual report clearly evidences more strategic action towards the goal of community resilience, one of four pillars of our current strategic plan to help build a community that works for everyone.

To that end, this year the efforts of the Community Foundation centered on a way back to a more connected life and a deeper sense of belonging, whether it was through highlighting youth mental health or exploring growing older together. During 2023, the Community Foundation became part of a national movement to help rebuild social trust and reknit the ties that bind. In January we launched the Elevate NOVA Book Circle with Mónica Guzmán’s *I Never Thought of It That Way: How to Have Fearlessly Curious Conversations in Dangerously Divided Times*. With 424 community members and 48 book clubs registered to read the book with us, many substantive discussions ensued across the region. As a capstone event, we held a fireside chat with the author that further explored social trust, civic healing, and her process for making us better and more curious listeners, especially when we disagree.

Throughout the year, it became clear that the way back is us. When we show up, do what we can, and hold hope, we become the cure. This annual report reflects the ongoing commitment of our donors, grantees, partners, and community members to value each other no matter our differences and to come together around shared solutions. It is a hopeful story of community love and caring, and we hope you enjoy it.

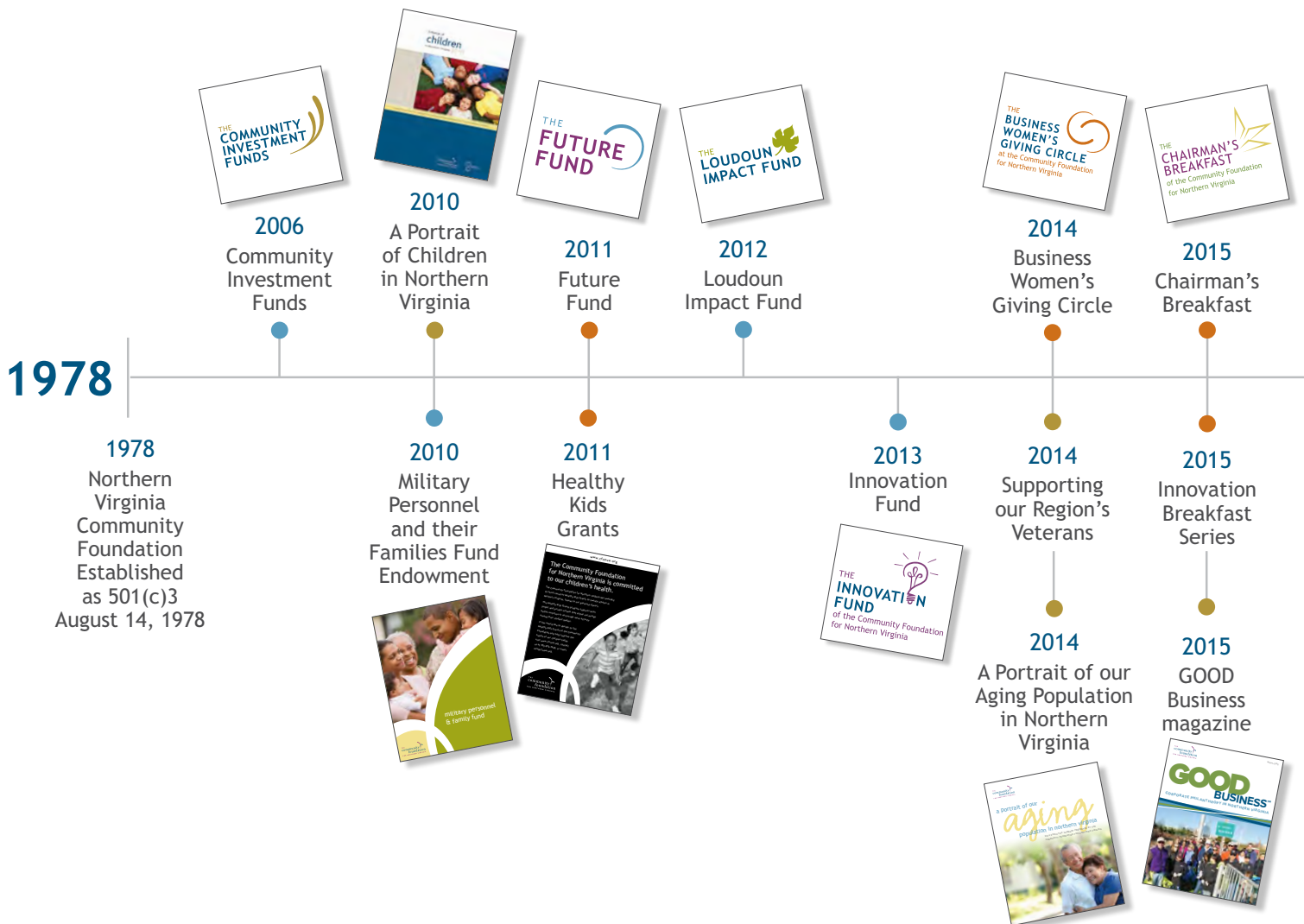

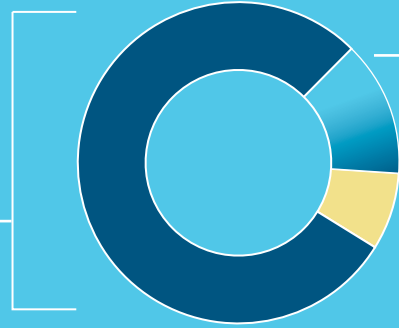

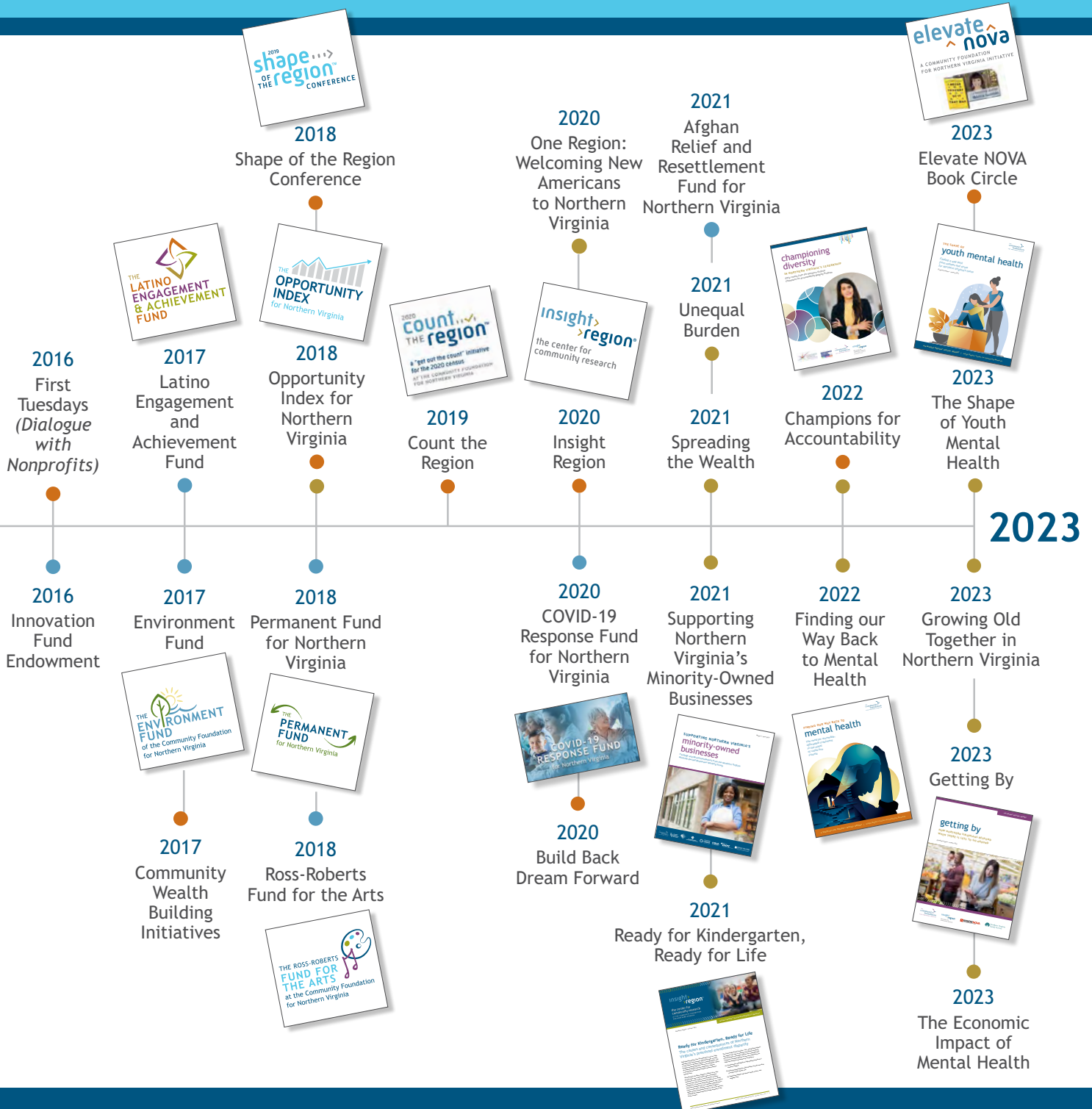

ELEVATE NOVA book circle



This year, the Community Foundation for Northern Virginia launched the Elevate NOVA Book Circle with Mónica Guzmán's book, *I Never Thought of It That Way: How to Have Fearlessly Curious Conversations in Dangerously Divided Times*.

Guzmán's book promotes community resilience, a pillar of the Community Foundation's 5-year strategic plan. It offers a thoughtful process for how good citizens in tough times can help bridge what divides us. Her unique formula for civic healing spurred conversations about how deeper listening and curiosity can bridge gaps in understanding, especially when we disagree.

More than 400 community members joined the book circle this year. Each received a copy of the book and participated in conversations with new or existing book clubs facilitated by discussion guides provided by the Community Foundation.

The initiative culminated in a fireside chat with Mónica Guzmán in November of 2023 – a capstone to the Community Foundation's first, but not its last, Elevate NOVA Book Circle.

About Mónica Guzmán

Mónica Guzmán can be described as a bridge builder, journalist, and author who lives for great conversations sparked by curious questions. She's Senior Fellow for Public Practice at Braver Angels and author of our selection and New York Times recommended read *I Never Thought of It That Way: How to Have Fearlessly Curious Conversations in Dangerously Divided Times*.

Mónica hosts a live interview series at Crosscut; and cofounded the award-winning Seattle newsletter *The Evergrey*. Her accomplishments include fellowships at the Henry M. Jackson Foundation and Nieman Foundation for Journalism at Harvard University. A Mexican immigrant, Latina, and dual US/Mexico citizen, she lives in Seattle with her husband and two kids and is the proud liberal daughter of conservative parents.

About the Book

With our community steeped in divide, Mónica set out to find what was blinding us and discovered the most eye-opening tool we're not using: our

own built-in curiosity. The book explores how avoiding one another is hurting our relationships and our society.

Mónica presents a timely and heartening guide, in a way that feels deeply personal yet universal. As the chief storyteller for the national cross-partisan depolarization organization Braver Angels, Mónica takes you to the real front lines of a crisis that threatens to grind America to a halt—broken conversations among confounded people.

In 2023, Insight Region[®], the Community Foundation's center for community research, produced a report in its ongoing series focused on the state of mental health in our region.

The Shape of Youth Mental Health

February 1, 2023

In February of 2023, Insight Region[®] released the "Shape of Youth Mental Health" report with a presentation and discussion at George Mason University. The report discusses the mental health needs of Northern Virginia's youth, which have only increased since the onset of the pandemic in 2020.

The 2022 Virginia School Survey of Climate and Working conditions shows that one in ten high school students have seriously contemplated suicide in the past year, while one in three have

symptoms of recent clinical anxiety. The report also found that girls, those who identify as LGBTQ+, older students, and Hispanic and Latino students are among those who are experiencing the largest increases in mental health need since the beginning of the pandemic. At the same time, many students do not get enough sleep, a symptom of poor mental health as well as a contributing factor.

The Community Foundation remains committed to supporting mental health organizations and initiatives that support early intervention for our region's youth and their families.

FOR ACCOUNTABILITY

Catalyzing more inclusive systems of economic growth throughout the Region

This year the Community Foundation partnered with the Northern Virginia Chamber of Commerce to launch Champions for Accountability, a new initiative to encourage greater transparency in the region's businesses to help catalyze more inclusive systems of economic growth throughout the region.

In its inaugural year, 53 organizations across the region received badges, indicating they have taken initial steps toward a more diverse and inclusive workforce within their companies.

The Community Foundation's Insight Region® produced a report that analyzed the demographics of the region's workforce with that of its C-Suite executives.

In 2020, an estimated 17 percent of the region's workers identified as Asian-Pacific Islander, 16 percent as Hispanic, 12 percent as Black, and 51 percent as White. Thirty-five percent immigrated from another country. Just over half of workers (53 percent) were male, and 47 percent were female. About 11 percent of NOVA workers who completed the Census's household pulse survey in 2021 identified as LGBTQ+.

Despite this tremendous diversity, we know that economic power has not been distributed evenly across the region. For example, while about half of workers in the region identify as White ...

- 67 percent of businesses with paid staff are under White ownership (Insight Region's *Minority Owned Businesses Report*)

- 66 percent of managers in Northern Virginia are White; 40 percent are White men (2015-19 ACS)
- 69 percent of workers who earn more than \$150,000 per year are White; 50 percent are White men (ACS 2020)

The Community Foundation does nothing alone. This partnership with the Northern Virginia Chamber of Commerce is one of many ways in which the Community Foundation and other regional anchor institutions are seeking to inspire and catalyze a more equitable and inclusive region.



SHAPE OF THE REGION conference

Growing Old Together in Northern Virginia: The Family, Homes, and Budgets our Region Needs as we Age
March 23, 2023



On March 23rd, the Community Foundation hosted its sixth annual Shape of the Region Conference in partnership with 14 regional organizations representing all sectors. This convening highlighted the complex challenges older Northern Virginians face, with a discussion around solutions to address the needs of caregivers, supply and affordability of housing, and innovative approaches to support aging in place.

At the conference, the Community Foundation presented the findings from its Insight Region® report, *Growing Old Together in Northern Virginia*. In 2020, there were 310,000 adults aged 65 or above in Northern Virginia, an increase of 61 percent since 2010. Rita B. Choula, MA, Senior Director of Caregiving at AARP's Public Policy

Institute and one of the keynote speakers, shared that in 2021, more than \$600 billion in unpaid caregiving was performed in the United States – \$14 billion in Virginia alone.

Speakers and panelists discussed how all sectors can lean in on this issue, elevate its importance and awareness across all platforms, advocate for changes to the system, and work to address the diverse needs of all aging Northern Virginians, so that we all can “age in place” in this community safely and with dignity.

The Community Foundation's 2022 Raise the Region Gala was back in-person on Friday, October 7, 2022, and celebrated the region's resilience, success, and growing sense of home and place. It was the first in-person gala in three years.

More than 500 guests joined in-person and another 100 tuned in to the virtual live stream. The event raised a total of \$650,000 to help support the Community Foundation's work – an incredibly heartening reunion and opportunity to celebrate the ties that bind us all together.

In addition, the Community Foundation awarded the 2022 Community Leadership Award that evening to Micron, presented annually for outstanding community service and dedication to improving the quality of life for all Northern Virginians.

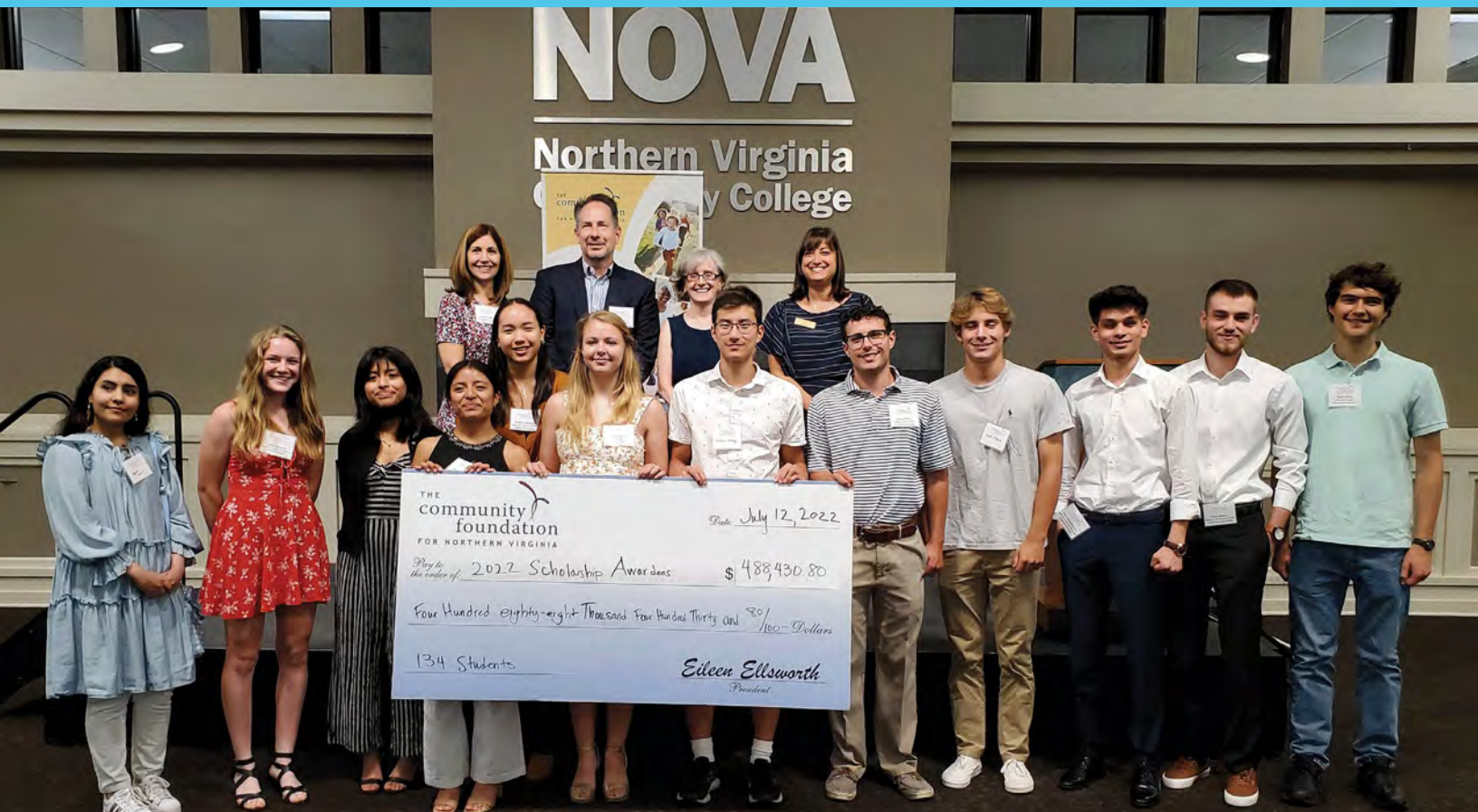

The Community Foundation’s Innovation Fund promotes inventiveness, creativity and new design, seeding a more innovative ecosystem in the region. Established in 2012, it became a component fund of the Permanent Fund for Northern Virginia in 2016 when community donors contributed \$500,000 to create an endowment that will forever allow this fund to seed innovation throughout the region.

In 2023, its annual grant was awarded to Future Kings, which offers a yearlong after-school STEM program for Northern Virginia students in need, many of whom are from Black and Latino families. The \$30,000 grant supported the creation of an “innovation pipeline” in Prince William County, offering college-level course materials specially designed for secondary students with an internship for graduate students that includes both teaching and working in a professional lab.

“We’re testing a twofold theory of change. First, the graduate students will be far more successful in obtaining jobs in the biomedical and life sciences fields with this hands-on work. Second, the program will grow a far more robust pipeline of middle and high schoolers who enter post-high school life sciences careers.”
